MINUTES

Stetchworth Parish Council Full Council Meeting on Tuesday 2nd March 2021

held online via online meeting platform Zoom

Present: Cllrs Lily Whymer (Chair), Wayne Bell, Sarah Breen, Alastair France, John Puddick, Piers Saunders and Alan Sharp. Clerk: Mrs Marilyn Strand.

There were no members of the public present.

The meeting was opened at 7:34pm.

Under the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020, this meeting was held remotely using an online meeting platform. The meeting will be open to the public (including the press).

116/20/21 To Approve the Minutes of the Meeting held on 26th January 2021 (to be signed at a later date).

The minutes of the meeting held on 26th January were approved as a true record. Due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, the original copy will be signed at a later date.

117/20/21 Matters Arising including reports from the Clerk and Councillors (for information only)

(a)

- Website upgrade the new website is now live and is being updated with information and pictures. Councillors were asked to send the Clerk a suitable photo of themselves for their profiles, and any photos of the parish they think suitable.
- Tree on recreation ground behind the Centre work was completed on 25th February. The leftover chippings were spread over footpath no. 3 (Strollers Way) to help improve the surface for walkers. The PC thanked Mr Michael Whymer for doing this.
- Crushed stone for car park extension Cllr Bell had spread approximately 4 tonnes of stone over the car park extension area which has vastly improved the surface. Cllr Bell had also tidied up the far end of this area, removing soil and unblocking the drain, and Councillors thanked him for doing this.
- Village Green registration the application form is in progress.
- Village Spring Clean Councillors were asked to come to next month's meeting with suggestions
 of areas that need to be cleared of litter, grass etc. Due to current restrictions on gathering, it was
 agreed to ask volunteers to take part as and when they can (and in their bubbles) to avoid a lot of
 people gathering at once.
- White Horse Stables the property owner has begun to remove the height of the close boarded fencing.
- Street Lighting the new inventory had been sent to UK Power Networks who should issue a new MPAN number which would reduce the electricity bills. This will be followed up as no reduction had occurred as yet.

118/20/21 The Ellesmere Centre

- (a) Ellesmere Centre Report Cllr Whymer reported the following: -
 - The Centre remains closed in line with government lockdown restrictions. The government's roadmap out of lockdown says that community centres can re-open on 12th April however, Trustees may decide to wait until May so that other limitations on groups and gatherings have also been lifted by the time of re-opening. The next Trustees' meeting is due to be held on 15th March and a decision is likely to be made then.

District Cllr Alan Sharp reported the following: -

- Cambridgeshire County Council has agreed to raise its portion of the Council Tax by 2.99%. This equates to a 1% rise for adult social care and a 1.99% rise for general funds.
- The County Council has budgeted £4m per year over the next four years for pavement improvements.
- ECDC has frozen its portion of the Council Tax for the 8th year running. However, it will be increased by £5 per Band D property over the following two years in order to maintain services.
- ECDC is restructuring its Finance & Assets Committee. It has been agreed that the Operational Services Committee will take on some of the functions of the Finance & Assets Committee to reduce its workload.
- Haddenham Community Land Trust (HCLT) the houses (some affordable) are for local people and, although built by ECDC, are being allocated by HCLT.
- Ashfield House, 20 High Street parking issues around the site persist and Cllr Sharp is liaising
 with ECDC enforcement and the developer to find a resolution. An on-site car park had been
 planned for February but this had been affected by the weather.
- County Cllr Mathew Shuter will be standing down at the elections on May 6th.

Cllr Whymer asked why ECDC hadn't contributed to the legal costs of Newmarket Town Council in its fight to keep the Weatherby Crossing open, particularly as many East Cambridgeshire residents in villages south of Newmarket would benefit from keeping the crossing open. District Cllr Sharp said it was because ECDC is not a highways authority. CCC had been asked to contribute but they had provided officer support instead.
