The meeting was opened at 7:30pm.

127/22/23 To receive & approve apologies for absence

The Chairman welcomed Limara Kempton to the meeting. Ms. Kempton has been elected to the Council and will take office on 9th May.

130/22/23 To Approve the Minutes of the Meeting held on 21st March 2023

The minutes of the meeting held on 21st March were approved as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

131/22/23 Matters Arising including reports from the Clerk and Councillors (for information only)

(a)

- PC laptop the old laptop will be advertised on eBay for £50.00.
- Elections the result of the election had been declared uncontested and Councillors will take office on 9th May.
- Motorbike on recreation ground Cllr Whymer had spotted a motorised bicycle being ridden on the recreation ground and had asked the rider to desist. It was agreed by all that no form of motorised vehicle should be used on the recreation ground.
- Internal Audit this will take place on Tuesday 25th April.
- Laurel on Church Lane the neighbouring property owner had agreed this should be removed. The Clerk is waiting to hear from UK Power Networks as to whether they agree that the Laurel can be removed as it is next to a substation.
- Access over amenity land Spencer Clark, ECDC, had confirmed he had previously given
 permission (some time ago) for a resident to use amenity land to access their property with building
 materials. However, permission had not been sought recently. It was agreed to let Mr. Clark know
 that a planning application at an address on the High Street for an extension is due to be submitted
 and that using the amenity land to access the rear of the property should be taken into
 consideration.
- It was agreed to write to Sanctuary Housing regarding no. 5 Coopers Close which remains unoccupied.
- Items for the newsletter include Voter ID for upcoming elections and the Coronation.
- Cllr Whymer confirmed that Mr. Michael Whymer would continue to carry out weekly checks on the play area equipment.
- The PC had received favourable comments from a columnist for the Newmarket Journal in relation to its liaison with Newmarket Town Council regarding their Neighbourhood Plan.

Cllr Sharp joined the meeting at 8pm.

132/22/23 The Ellesmere Centre

- (a) Ellesmere Centre Report Cllr Whymer reported the following: -
 - The early morning cleaner has left and a new person has been appointed and will start soon.
 - The Post Office is currently closed due to staff illness. It is not known when it might be able to reopen.
- (b) To consider post and rail fencing to replace temporary fencing between the MUGA and car park it was AGREED to accept the quotation from the PC's handyman for £275.00.

133/22/23 District & County Councillors' Reports

District & County Cllr Sharp reported the following: -

- Eighty members of the public had attended the CCC full council meeting on 21st March to hear about the proposed Cambourne to Cambridge Busway which, if approved, would cut through a 100year-old orchard at Coton. It is likely that a planning application will be submitted for this which will almost certainly result in a public enquiry.
- A petition against the proposed Congestion Charge for Cambridge had collected 15,500 signatures.
 Results of the public consultation are expected later in the year.
- CCC had recently held meetings to discuss what to do about the huge number of potholes appearing all over the county, some of which are reappearing due to poor workmanship on repairs.
 Cllr Sharp said that budget restrictions were part of the problem as the budget had been kept the same by the ruling group of Councillors even though building materials inflation is running at about 20%.
- ECDC had cancelled its full council meeting in April as there had been no business to discuss. The next meeting will now be held after the elections on.
- Cllr Sharp had enjoyed the privilege of meeting HRH Prince Edward, The Duke of Edinburgh, when His Royal Highness visited a chocolate factory in Ely, and the Viva Arts Centre in Soham recently.
- Cllr Sharp had attended a meeting of Newmarket Vision where one of the topics of discussion had been the cost of relocating the town's market.

However, Councillors did not agree that purchasing plastic surrounds for the holes was beneficial in terms of the overall environmental impact of producing these.
